ORGANIZATION

Lee University is a private, comprehensive university located in Cleveland, Tennessee, in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains. Lee has emerged as a leader in higher education in the southeastern region and is consistently ranked in the "Top Tier" of the Best Regional Universities in the South by U.S. News & World Report. Lee is also ranked by Princeton Review's "Best Colleges," and is one of the 141 colleges named Best in the Southeast.

Over the past two decades, Lee has become one of the largest Christ-centered private institutions in the Southeast. During that period, the university has seen a remarkable transformation that has included significant growth in its academic programs, student enrollment, faculty expertise, and diversity, as well as an expanded sense of mission and vision.

Lee University in recent years has been recognized as an institution of national standing in many areas that are frequently ranked by outside observers. One of the reasons for this emergence is that Lee stands out in a select group of higher education institutions, that of Christ-centered, liberal arts colleges and universities. Another reason is that Lee's original core values and goals have remained strong even as it has adapted to the changing landscape of academic and professional life.

Lee University traces its origins to humble beginnings over a century ago. The Church of God initiated plans for a Bible training school culminating in the school's establishment in Cleveland, Tennessee, in 1918. The first term began with 12 students and one teacher, Mrs. Nora B. Chambers. As enrollment grew, the school relocated multiple times to accommodate its expanding needs, including moves to Sevierville, Tennessee, and back to Cleveland in 1947, where it acquired the former Bob Jones College campus. This historic site became the institution's permanent home.

Renamed Lee College in 1947 to honor its second president, F. J. Lee, the school continued to grow and adapt, laying the groundwork for the transformative changes and remarkable expansion that began in the 1980s.

The liberal arts emphasis at Lee College came into its own in the mid-1980s with a deliberate move to embrace the broader evangelical Christian community. The shift brought an influx of new students and faculty. In the thirty-four years between 1986 and 2020, student enrollment more than quadrupled from 1200 to more than 5100.

Lee remains committed to its sponsoring denomination, but the institution's broad enrollment policy attracts students from a variety of religious traditions, academic abilities, and ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds. Lee draws students from nearly all 50 states and more than 50 countries.

The faculty has also grown and diversified to keep pace with the 57 undergraduate majors, 159 undergraduate programs, and 56 graduate programs in its six schools: School of Business, College of Arts & Sciences, the Helen DeVos College of Education, the School of Music, the School of Religion, and the School of Nursing. Faculty members come from around the world and represent a wide range of academic, cultural, and evangelical Christian backgrounds.

Campus construction programs have added 100 acres and more than 23 major buildings to Lee's landscape over the past thirty years. Among these are eight dormitories, six classroom buildings, a student union building, a chapel, two recreation centers and two athletic facilities, a health clinic, a recital hall, and a recording studio.

At the turn of the new millennium, Lee University emerged as a leader in higher education by integrating benevolence, service learning, personal strengths development, and cross-cultural studies into every student's educational experience. This innovative approach earned Lee numerous accolades. In 2017-2018, The Institute of International Education Open Doors (IIEOD) ranked Lee among the Top 5 institutions nationwide for the highest percentage of students participating in Study Abroad programs and among the Top 15 for the total number of study abroad students.

Lee is also renowned for its exceptional music programs, which have produced award-winning ensembles and artists celebrated on national and international stages. The Lee University Singers, Voices of Lee, and Lee Festival Choir are recognized for their extraordinary performances worldwide.

In addition to these distinctions, Lee has received recognition from the Templeton Foundation, earning a place on its Honor Roll of Character Building Colleges. It has also been featured on the Corporation for National and Community Service's Honor Roll multiple times, including receiving its prestigious President's Award, an honor shared with only five other American universities. Lee has further been celebrated as one of the "Great Colleges to Work For" by the Chronicle of Higher Education.

As the new president steps in, they will lead a university renowned for its innovation, dedication to its mission, and commitment to academic excellence. The president will continue to strengthen Lee University's position as a top-tier, Christ-centered institution, building on its remarkable growth and global influence.

Faith Statement

Lee University, a Christ-centered University, is committed to a conservative, evangelical, Pentecostal religious faith as outlined in the Church of God Declaration of Faith:

- In the verbal inspiration of the Bible.
- In one God eternally existing in three persons; namely, the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.
- That Jesus Christ is the only begotten Son of the Father, conceived of the Holy Ghost, and born of the Virgin Mary.
- That Jesus was crucified, buried, and raised from the dead. That He ascended to heaven and is today at the right hand of the Father as the Intercessor.
- That all have sinned and come short of the glory of God and that repentance is commanded of God for all and necessary for forgiveness of sins.
- That justification, regeneration, and the new birth are wrought by faith in the blood of Jesus Christ.
- In sanctification subsequent to the new birth, through faith in the blood of Christ; through the Word, and by the Holy Ghost.
- Holiness to be God's standard of living for His people.
- In the baptism with the Holy Ghost subsequent to a clean heart.
- In speaking with other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance and that it is the initial evidence of the baptism of the Holy Ghost.
- In water baptism by immersion, and all who repent should be baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.
- Divine healing is provided for all in the atonement.
- In the Lord's Supper and washing of the saints' feet.
- In the premillennial second coming of Jesus. First, to resurrect the righteous dead and to catch away the living saints to Him in the air. Second, to reign on the earth a thousand years.
- In the bodily resurrection, eternal life for the righteous, and eternal punishment for the wicked.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, Lee University is actively searching for its next president to strategically guide the 106-year-old institution into its next season of growth and opportunity. Located in the heart of scenic southeast Tennessee, Lee is a well-respected private Christian university with a strong connection to its community. Currently led by Dr. Paul Conn, who serves as both President and Chancellor, the university is poised for new leadership.

Dr. Conn assumed the new role of President and Chancellor on May 5, 2024, after an inspiring

tenure as President that lasted 34 years and a subsequent term of nearly four years as Chancellor. Dr. Conn, along with his wife Darlia McLuhan Conn, led the university through a transformative period in the 80's and 90's, maintaining Lee's institutional momentum into the new millennium and beyond the school's 2018 centennial. Dr. Conn will continue in his role as Chancellor after the new president is named, ensuring a seamless transition as Lee embarks on its next chapter.

The Lee University Board of Directors (Board) is responsible for the search and selection of the President, as outlined in governing documents. Recognizing the importance of the task, and the incredible place the university holds in the hearts of its students, faculty, staff, alumni, and friends, the Board has initiated several next steps, including the appointment of a Presidential Search Committee (Committee). Board members on the Committee are engaged day-to-day in the process; other representatives are involved in an active advising role.

OBJECTIVES & EXPECTATIONS

During the first year, the new President will need to establish credibility as a strategic servant leader, gaining in-depth insights into Lee University, and establishing a direction for the organization. In addition, specific goals that have been identified as measures of success for the first 12 to 18 months include:

- **Spiritual Leadership:** Provide clear, compassionate spiritual guidance to the university community, ensuring that Lee's Christian identity remains central to its mission. Inspire students, faculty, and staff to live out their faith in all areas of life, integrating biblical truth into academic, social, and professional pursuits. Serve as a role model in spiritual growth, leading with humility, integrity, and a deep commitment to fostering a Christ-centered community.
- **Vision:** Articulate and communicate an inspiring and compelling vision, firmly grounded in cherished Lee roots and heritage and appropriately inculcated with innovative goals and objectives for the future, to all Lee stakeholders. This message should become a rallying point, providing a cohesive identity and sense of direction for Lee University over the next 10 years.
- Fundraising and Finances: Strengthen and expand fundraising efforts, focusing on endowment growth, unrestricted gifts, and diversifying revenue sources. Ensure sound financial practices by adhering to operating budgets, investing in reserves for long-term sustainability, and securing new income-generating opportunities.
- **Enrollment**: Focus on enrollment stabilization and growth, recognizing the importance of achieving two to three early wins to inspire confidence and build momentum in leadership.
- **Relationship Building:** Foster healthy internal and external relationships with care, humility, intention, and courage. Build the trust of faculty, and all Lee University employees, as a thoughtful leader who engages with appropriate transparency, boundaries, and consensus building and serves as a shield when necessary. Engage the denomination with mutual respect and in a spirit of openness, collaboration, collegiality, and shared purpose.
- Leadership Development: Empower and develop leadership within the institution, inspiring members of the cabinet to own their roles with enthusiasm, innovation, and

- optimism and develop and provide leadership development pathways for high-potential employees at all levels of the organization.
- Collaboration: Forge a cooperative and collaborative, effective, and dynamic partnership with Chancellor Conn, characterized by mutual respect, thought and operational partnership, and leadership seeking to complement one another's strengths and leadership approaches for the shared good of Lee University, its mission, and consistencies.
